Delegate's Reflections on Service to AA after attending the 75th General Service Conference

District 4,

Thank you for the opportunity to share this with you and kudos to your District Jeopardy get together, great fellowship, camaraderie and spirit, a beautiful day.

My experience as delegate for Area 50 Panel 74 enriches my heart with events such as this. AA at its core, as written beautifully by Milton Maxwell GSB chair in 1980 wrote: "AA Unity is not based on Authority but upon accepting differences, allowing freedom, and keeping our focus on the primary purpose of helping one another achieve and maintain sobriety"

He goes on to write that "Basically the spiritual part of the program means an unselfish-centered approach to everything. Not insisting on having our own way but accepting what is best for AA as a whole. The AA way is to give each individual his dignity and freedom, each group its dignity and each country or region its dignity and freedom"

I keep this with me and read it before each AA event that I attend. It reminds me, I know very little about what's important to the members of AA. To share my experiences with AA in a manner that conveys not only the spiritual experience we share along with the knowledge and faith that if I listen intently with an open mind, there's a guarantee I will learn something new from you all.

AA in Area 50 is strong, District 4 highlights this, always has been and growing stronger. We have an almost innate understanding of what the new comer and the alcoholic who still suffers craves. Making this available, understanding our primary purpose with the knowledge that together with compassion, understanding and love anyone can be successful in our community.

The growth of the service structure in Area 50 (by the way, all of AA is service in some form or another!) continues. When asked what my goal was for the Area At the beginning of my Panel, I said 100 GSR's. While we're not at the number, which was a line in the sand, we are trending in that direction! Who knows we may get there by Panel 76.

Keeping the district work going, other districts will emulate your work and grow in their own way. It is the natural progression once the groups are established and familiar with the service structure.

As a fellow member of the conference, along with all of you, the conference taught me to be a better steward of AA, to make it attractive and to truly put my faith into actions that benefit all of AA. I have been

spiritually rearranged, never expected, yet eternally grateful. It is my sincerest hope that we all have the opportunity to see what God has in store for us all. Together we can.
